



**A Student Senator / Faculty Councillor shall:**

1. perform any duties which the Vice-President, Academic Affairs and/or Council may require;
2. serve a term from the first of June to the thirty-first of May;
3. be an informed advocate of student concerns and issues, in particular at the meetings of Senate, Council, and the MASU;
4. be responsible for accurate and regular communication of MASU policies and decisions to her/his constituents;
5. facilitate the success of MASU operations and services through participation;
6. sit on at least two Senate Committees assigned by the Vice-President, Academic Affairs and ratified by Senate through the Senate Committee on Committees;
7. sit on the MASU Academic Affairs Committee;
8. attend all meetings and forums of Council and the MASU;
9. attend all meetings of standing committees on which they sit;
10. represent the educational, social, and personal concerns of Mount Allison students with an aim to improve student life;
11. meet regularly with student representatives on department committees;
12. serve as a student representative on any other Board of Regents committees that Council deems appropriate;
13. provide timely reports to Council and the MASU on the policies and decisions of their assigned Senate Committees;
14. be responsible for accurate and regular communication of MASU policies and decisions to Senate; and
15. be aware of the specific issues which are of importance to students that may include but are not limited to: Senate, Academic Judicial, Academic Appeals, Admissions, Research, and Degree Programmes.
