MASU PRESIDENT ELECTED CHAIR OF NEW BRUNSWICK STUDENT ALLIANCE

SACKVILLE, NB — On Sunday, April 30, 2017, former Vice-President Communications Sara Camus was named Chair of New Brunswick Student Alliance (NBSA). Camus was elected President of the Mount Allison Students' Union (MASU) during the winter elections, effective May 1, 2017.

The Executive Director of NBSA Rob Burroughs believes that, "Sara brings with her experience from working closely with our 2016-2017 Board and her election as Chair represents a very bold statement by the Board with respect to its priorities for the upcoming year." During her 2016-2017 Vice Presidency term, Camus sat on the Board of Directors working alongside Burroughs. "We are delighted that the MASU has yet again taken a leadership role within the NBSA. I look forward to working under her direction," says the Executive Director Burroughs.

"We are partial to prioritizing systemic issues such as, physical accessibility on campus, access to mental health, and indigenizing the academy."
