MASU VICE PRESIDENT ELECTED VICE-CHAIR OF NEW BRUNSWICK STUDENT ALLIANCE

SACKVILLE, NB — On Saturday, April 30, 2016, former Vice-President of Communications, Tina Oh, was named Vice-Chair of the New Brunswick Student Alliance (NBSA). Oh was elected Vice-President External Affairs in the Mount Allison Students' Union's (MASU) winter elections, effective May 1, 2016.

Oh will be working alongside the new executive director of the NBSA and Mount Allison alumnus, Rob Burroughs: "We are delighted that the MASU has yet again taken a leadership role within the NBSA. Tina has already established herself as a vital component of our executive team and I look forward to working under her direction."
