program, urging the government to take immediate action to remediate the consequences being felt by students across the province.

## NB-EI Connect Update

September 4th, 2022
As reported on earlier, the GNB announced that the NB-EI Connect program which allowed almost 7000 students in NB to claim El while in school, will no longer be operational. Since then, the MASU and NBSA have been advocating for mitigating measures.

A press release was published outlining students' concerns on the matter. Student testimonials and feedback was collected through social media and an online form to better understand student perspectives (30 responses garnered). MASU President \& CEO (Rohin) completed interviews with CHMA, CBC and other New Brunswick media.

Furthermore, the President and VP, External ( Ngoc ) met with Trevor Holder, the Minister of Post-Secondary Education, Training, and Labor (PETAL) in a scheduled meeting on student issues. NB-El Connect was a focal point in this discussion. Finally, the NBSA met with the Department of PETAL which included a meeting with Minister Holder to present asks from the NBSA. The asks (in brief) were:
(1) Create a 1-year grace period for the program
(2) Creation of adequate needs-based grants for those affected
(3) An official statement explaining the discontinuation to students
(4) Consultation on any similar future decisions

While the MASU and NBSA have been pushing for a response statement from the Dept. of PETAL, we have yet to hear back after multiple requests.
