Reports

- Councillor Minocha-Mckenney

- In the past month, Councillor Minocha-Mckenney has been focusing their time on aiding in putting on a successful orientation, Shine day and concert. Councillor Minocha-Mckenney is satisfied with the turnout of all these events. As well, Councillor Minocha-Mckenney would like to thank the orientation chair, Alix Corwin, as well as all the people involved in the aforementioned events for their hard work.
- Councillor Minocha-Mckenney has also been working on accumulating information from the student body to aid in identifying the key concepts the STAT plan should focus on.
- Going forward, Councillor Minocha-Mckenney intends to prioritize SAC training, fall elections, committee appointments, STRAT planning and truth and reconciliation day planning.

- Councillor Warr

- In the past month, Councillor Warr has been focusing her time on orientation, residence leader training, preparing for social caucus, the keep it social campaign, and harms reduction presentation.

- Councillor Warr noted that while she is unsure as to what will happen with homecoming because of the hurricane, planning has been done to ensure there are outreach booths around campus as a harms reduction outreach in the event that homecoming occurs.
- Furthermore, Councillor Warr reported that there has not been much progress to her Accessibility document because her efforts have been elsewhere; however, there is an intention to get back to this project.

Discussion:

- Councillor Chun

- Currently, one of Councillor Chun's larger projects is collecting student input on speakers they would like to come to campus for the President speakers series.
- Going forward, Councillor Chun intends to prioritize bigger advocacies in senate, OERs, Scholarships and bursaries, and supporting the senators.

Discussion:

- Councillor Minocha-Mckenney: Question concerning scholarship and bursaries: Last year there were recommendations made concerning changes to scholarships and bursaries what is the likelihood of this being brought forward as a motions?
- Councillor Chun: It is unlikely. However, Councillor Krueger is on the senate again this year and they worked hard for it, so I think we will keep bringing it up. However, I don't see it as very likely that it will get passed.

- Councillor Mittal

- In the past month, Councillor Mittal has acted as a secondary photographer during orientation events, done outreach for job services, speaker events and election posters, released the second edition of the MASU herald, finished the new branding guidelines, and has completed various publication requests for clubs and societies.
- Going forward, Councillor Mittal intends to complete the hiring process of a second Allisonian editor, and complete an advocacy report by the next council meeting

- Councillor Huynh

- In the past month, Councillor Huynh has been focusing his time on presenting the MASU at town hall and establishing good relations within the community.
- Going forward, Councillor Huynh intends to create a campaign concerning off campus housing for people trying to move off campus next year. Moreover, Councillor Huynh intends to continue building good relationships between the MASU and the community.
